the money to the Indian. Provision for
others than Indians who have committed
their crimes.*

Sir:-

I have the honor to forward herewith, an application made by Mrs Dacoteau, formerly a member of Red Pheasants Band of Indians, residing in the Battleford Agency, to be readmitted to membership of the Band.

Her father and uncles, and in fact all her relations have always been the best of Indians, and during times of trouble, including the period of the late Rebellion, they have always been loyal to the Authorities.

The Agent along with other people, residents in the section of the country, urges that the petition be granted.

I may remind the Department, that her late husband was cruelly murdered about a year ago by an American citizen. He had been as is stated in the petition, a servant of the Department for a long time, and was faithful to its interests.

May I ask the Department's favorable consideration of the case, which I beg to recommend as a special one?
